



Purpose:	This Project includes the purchase and installation of one fire detection and confirmation camera at Soda Springs Ski Resort to serve the Serene Lakes and surrounding Donner summit communities. Serene Lakes Community on Donner Summit represents over 1,100 properties of which approx. 850 have homes/structures.		
Deliverables:	Purchase and Installation of tower and camera with infrared capabilities to be incorporated into UNR alert wildfire camera system.		
Permitting strategy:	CEQA Notice of exemption (15304 – minor alteration to land), Truckee fire assumed lead agency.		
Project Status:	Tower and Camera installation anticipated Spring 2024 (once snow melts)

Purpose:	This project will implement a 130-acre timber harvest and fuel reduction project within the 2,200-acre Royal Gorge Property. This is a high priority area to complete fuels reduction work and will provide a direct benefit to protecting the treasured recreational opportunities, and the communities within Donner Summit, and the Town of Truckee.		
Deliverables:	Mechanical thinning, biomass removal, mastication on 130 high priority acres.		
Permitting strategy:	Forest Fire Prevention Exemption (14 CCR 1038.3), Filed by RPF Danielle Bradfield (Consulting Forester for TDLT)		
Project Status:	Project delayed due to snow, Planned implementation in spring 2024 (once snow melts)



Project area:	Forested areas surrounding the Sugar Bowl Ski Team & Academy Building		
Purpose:	This project will reduce hazardous fuel accumulations on 12 acres of densely forested areas adjacent to the Sugar Bowl Ski Team & Academy. Educational opportunities for students once work is completed.		
Deliverables:	Manual and Mechanical forest thinning and fuel reduction on 12 acres. SBSTA has secured funding to complete 4 acres of matching contribution work within the defensible space zone. This grant funding will enable an additional 8 acres to be treated, which will improve the overall impact of SBSTA's defensible space work.		
Permitting strategy:	Forest Fire Prevention Exemption (14 CCR 1038.3), Filed by RPF Danielle Bradfield (Consulting Forester for Sugar Bowl Corp.) Small portion of the project will also be covered by a 15304 CEQA exemption (minor alteration to land).		
Project Status:	Project is delayed due to snow, planned implementation spring 2024 (once snow melts)		



Deliverables:	This wildfire preparedness project will support the purchase and install of street, address, bridge, and emergency egress signs to be professionally installed within both communities.			
Permitting strategy:	15304 CEQA exemption (minor alteration to land), Truckee Fire Assumed lead agency.





